SPRING INSTITUTE HOSTS LUNCHEON EVENT CELEBRATING IMMIGRANT AND REFUGEE INCLUSION IN COLORADO

Their advocacy in collaboration with Spring Institute was instrumental in enacting Senate Bill 23-007 to enhance adult education in Colorado.
- **Denver Regional Council of Governments (DRCOG)**, a planning organization that facilitates local government collaboration to establish guidelines, set policy and allocate funding in areas of transportation and personal mobility, growth and development, and aging and disability resources. Their Older Adult Refugees and Friends program collaborates with Spring Institute to deliver English language adult education and other integration programming for older adult newcomers.
- Hope Communities, a nonprofit organization that strengthens communities and provides pathways to economic and personal opportunity through affordable housing, educational programs and support services. Their Hidden Brook apartment complex in the East Colfax neighborhood serves as a hub for Spring Institute's community-based integration programming, including early childhood education and youth engagement opportunities.
