- supported <u>House Bill 24-1009 (Bilingual Child Care Licensing Resources)</u>, allowing Spanish-speaking child care providers get licenses and trainings in their preferred language
- influenced other policies related to paid family leave, protections for mobile home park residents, emergency alerts, and language access at state agencies
