OUR CORE PROGRAMS

ADULT EDUCATION & CAREER PATHWAYS

Spring Institute offers cost free and convenient classes and career coaching to help adult learners achieve their personal goals and workforce aspirations. Students learn and practice the fundamentals of English to communicate with others, discover cultural differences, and obtain new strategies for continued independent learning and workforce networking. We also provide customized English classes for employers, businesses, and organizations.

COLORADO WELCOME BACK

Colorado Welcome Back has been working for over a decade to build bridges between the talented pool of internationally trained health workers living in Colorado and the growing need for a diverse, linguistically inclusive, and culturally competent healthcare workforce. We provide individualized training, navigation resources, educational scholarships, and career coaching to help medical professionals re-establish their healthcare careers in Colorado.

ADVOCACY

Spring Institute engages in policy advocacy on issues that impact immigrants, refugees, and the intercultural welcoming community. Priority issues include early childhood education and care for linguistically diverse families, adult education, language access, mental health, credentialing pathways for internationally trained professionals, and more.

CULTURAL RESOURCE NAVIGATION

Our specialized cultural resource navigation teams support linguistically diverse individuals and families in accessing services and resources in healthcare, preschool and K-12 enrollment, transportation, and public benefits.

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Our Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPPY) program engages families in community-based learning and empowers immigrant and refugee parents in culturally responsive, linguistically accessible early childhood education strategies promoting family bonding, intergenerational learning, and school readiness.

YOUTH ENGAGEMENT

Formerly known as Project SHINE, programming through Community Shines promotes physical and behavioral health and immigrant and refugee integration through a variety of community-based enrichment opportunities for young people and families. Youth programs include academic tutoring, access to mental health services, bicycle and water safety training, martial arts, and hiking and running clubs.
