The Colorado Language Access Coalition (CLAC) is a group of 140+ people who care deeply about language access. The group includes community members and individuals who work for government or nonprofits.

We support public policies that help every Coloradan communicate and receive understandable information in the language they prefer.



Since it started in August 2023, CLAC has...

- published a [statement](#) on the Dept. of Justice memorandum directing a reduction of multilingual services in federal agencies;
- led [House Bill 25-1153 \(Statewide Government Language Access Assessment\)](#), initiating an evaluation of language access services at state agencies;
- provided ongoing input on the creation of a statewide language access policy, including via contributions to a [Language Access Policy Recommendations Report](#);
- published a [statement](#) on President Trump's Executive Order targeting language access (Executive Order 14224);
- championed [House Bill 24-1368 \(Language Access Advisory Board\)](#), helping to improve language access in Colorado's law-making process;
- supported [House Bill 24-1009 \(Bilingual Child Care Licensing Resources\)](#), allowing Spanish-speaking child care providers access licenses and trainings in their preferred language.
